Valuing Each Person

For many years, Woodbury Lutheran has loved people. This love started when Pastor Paul and Rhoda Pfotenhauer began ministering to the community of Woodbury nearly 50 years ago, and continues to this day. It has been a part of who we are, both as a staff and a congregation. And that love has been shared with all people, no matter who they are or what they are going through. It is, after all, one of our values: "We Value Each Person." March is Disabilities Ministry month at WLC, and over the 5 years that I have been here, it has been a privilege to see the love of Jesus shared with so many people, no matter what their condition.

WLC has a long tradition of serving those with disabilities, in large part, because of the intentional ministry to people with disabilities. It can sometimes be difficult to measure the effectiveness of ministry. How do we know if we are doing the Lord's work? A number of years ago in one of our newsletters, the following was printed:

"10 Practical Tips for Becoming a Disability Friendly Church"

1. Provide a warm, friendly, welcoming environment.
2. Provide basic disability awareness training for your church staff and volunteers.
3. Improve accessibility. Make modifications where necessary.
4. Provide serving opportunities for people with disabilities.
5. Provide disability friendly materials.
6. Provide space for wheelchair users throughout the sanctuary.
7. Provide a sign interpreter for people who are deaf or hard of hearing.

General communication and interaction tips.

1. Treat people with disabilities as you would anyone else.
2. Speak directly with the person with the disability, not through their parents or caregivers.
3. Put the person first, not their disability.

4. Provide assistance in the handicap parking area.
5. Provide a "buddy" or mentor for those who might need assistance.

As I look over these tips, I praise God that so many of them are being followed consistently. You don't have to be a part of the Disabilities Ministry team to show the love of Jesus to those who are struggling with a disability. I see it on Sunday mornings from ushers and congregation members alike.

Introducing Matt Krotzer, Oak Hill Worship Leader


A little bit about the Krotzer Crew....

We are a mission minded family with great passions for global ministry including orphan care, poverty alleviation & clean water projects, and music ministry. We have been blessed with opportunity to serve in Mexico, Taiwan, and Congo as a family. We absolutely love immersing in the culture, learning the language, and trying new foods. In addition to our adoption process we are currently in partnership with our daughters' orphanage working on a sustainability plan and provision for the 50+ kiddos that call it home.

We are all so excited to continue to grow and serve with our new church family and look forward to what this year holds.

How I Know Woodbury Lutheran

I got to know Woodbury Lutheran through some of my personal supporters and close friends of my parents, Duane and Joyce Klepel. Some of my personal supporters have attended Woodbury Lutheran Church for many years and they are Will Bartley, Bob and Karen Johnson, Kavin and Mary Landgrebe and Julie. Will Bartley was part of the missions board and he, Kavin and Bob tried to get Woodbury to support me when I first started. Then we met Chuck Kenow. He was very interested and heard what I was doing as a missionary. Chuck was really touched with what I do and he talked to the missions board. I came to, and presented to, the missions board about what I was doing and planning to do. They were very excited and very interested in supporting me.

Woodbury Lutheran is the biggest supporter I have and I am very blessed and thankful for Woodbury Lutheran. Without you I would not be doing most of the ministry that I am doing now. I am so blessed by Woodbury Lutheran.

Plans for 2015:

At this moment I am in my 2nd year of School of Ministry in Redding, CA. From March 19 to March 31, I will be going back to Bulgaria for a missions trip. Our team will be working in the slums and the poorest of the poor gypsies. We will be feeding 500 widows and orphans in Bulgaria. I am from Bulgaria and I was adopted by Duane and Joyce Klepel. I was adopted at age 12 1/2 years old. God gave me vision for the orphans and the girls that are trafficked and the kids who are at risk. I have a heart for the orphans and the widows and the trafficked victims. I will be still trying to find my real parents on this trip. I will finish the school of ministry on May 7th.

On May 8th, I will be heading back to China for 4 orphan camps and visit 4 of the leper colonies that we minister to. I will be there for almost 3 months. From China I will be heading for 3 weeks to Kyrgistan to speak to the government about social justice and implementing human development in the orphanage system in that country.

September I will be back in Redding, CA for my 3rd year and intern for 9 months. They have a large Human Trafficking Ministry in Redding and in San Francisco. The ministry there is opening a safe house for girls that are trafficked and a transitional home for boys and girls that are trafficked. I will be mentored and coached and will live with them for 9 months. I will learn from them about how I can manage a team and start my own project like theirs. I will also be traveling with them and speaking in churches with them. I will help build an Agape Village for foster families, a safe house for girls and boys who are trafficked and a family home for kids who don't have parents. This couple in this ministry will mentor me and coach me through every step of the way in their vision and will help me accomplish and build my vision for the children at risk.

Those are my plans for 2015! Thank you for everything and blessings to you Woodbury Lutheran. Thanks for all you do for me. Love you and miss you all. ~ Rosen Klepel

Tiling...Carpeting...Painting... Oh My!

A Spring and Summer of Changes

It is going to be a busy year as we continue many much needed building improvements. We have already begun many of them and others will be starting over the next few months.

Painting started several weeks ago in the Kids Ministry area downstairs. We are painting all of the classrooms, large gathering spaces and door frames. Beginning late March all of the carpet in the same areas will be replaced. It will be a mess for a while and will probably be a little inconvenient too, but we are excited by what it will look like when complete. We are also hoping to do some much needed carpet replacement in the Preschool areas.

We are replacing the old rectangular florescent lights in the upstairs hallway. That work started February 23rd and should be done within a week. You may not even notice that work but it will really make the hallway look nice and with the new LED lights should save on electrical and replacement costs.

We have detailed plans to remodel the upstairs main bathrooms and have approved the new materials. Work on those areas will start after Easter because the main upstairs bathrooms will be out of service for a few weeks while the work is done. We are also adding a family restroom near the nursery area that will make it easier for moms and dads to handle multiple kids needs and will be handicapped accessible.

Another big change will be in the Fireside room. We will be filling in the hole in that room and removing the ceiling cove. The walls will be sheet rocked and new sound and video systems will be installed. This will sig-

nificantly change the look of the room and will make it safer and more usable for all sizes of groups.


We also have bids to fully repair the east parking lot. The entire lot will be removed, soft clay will be replaced and new underlayment and asphalt will be installed. This will occur when weather permits.

All of this is being paid for with GREATER financial support, past years surplus gifts and from the general operating budget.

You will see changes over the next few weeks and months. I appreciate your patience and understanding. We all thank you for your generous contributions that have made all of this possible.

Annual Good Friday Prayer Vigil





IT'S A BEAUTIFUL DAY IN your neighborhood

A couple of years ago I had lunch with a friend who's a church consultant. Some of the largest churches in the country call upon him to share his experience and wisdom, and still he takes time to meet with young, enthusiastic pastors looking to plant small start-up churches. He shared how these wide-eyed young men and women come to him sure that they've heard from God about reaching their communities. They go into great detail as they share their passion and experience and talk about how they hope God will use them to change the world.

My friend then showed me something he communicates to these enthusiastic pastors-to-be that stops most of them in their tracks. I know it rocked my world. He pulled out a napkin and drew the following diagram:



He explained, "This is your neighborhood. You live in the house in the middle. If you can tell me the stories of the neighbors who live to the right and left of you as well as those who live in the three homes directly across the street, then you're ready to change the world for Jesus!"

Wow! I knew I wouldn't be able to recount the stories of those who lived closest to me. And according to my friend, 99 percent of these young ministers can't either. He sends them on their way back home and tells them to get to know their neighbors—encouraging them and reminding them that loving their neighbors is the best place to start their ministry.

Needless to say, this diagram impacted and convicted me! I recognized that it's my responsibility to know and love my neighbors. It's easy to wave and quickly duck in my car to drive away to my job in ministry. Or to walk out and grab the mail with a quick, "Hello, how are you?" when secretly I'm hoping they don't make eye contact and just say, "Great!" and allow me to get on my way. It's much more difficult to stop and take the time to listen and then respond to their needs.

I knew this was something I needed to change—after all, I have the responsibility to model this kind of neighborly love to my grandchildren. We began by having conversations about the importance of being kind, caring, and respectful to those who live near us. We also discussed that those we should consider our neighbors don't necessarily live next door or across the street—but loving those who do is a great place to start showing God's love. We now look for opportunities to bless our neighbors, and we've started praying for them as we get to know their stories and hear their needs.

Our grandkids can be world-changers for Jesus, and we can play a large role in their ministries by simply following Jesus' command to love our neighbors.
