And as we left and returned home, we knew that we had impacted this community once again and blessed them with our time amongst them. We have left a family that loves us and we love them...and God loves us all!



Be Still!

“Be Still and Know that I am God.” ~ Psalm 46:10

As we have been spending time in Exodus this summer one of the themes that I have noticed popping up over and over again is how God is constantly reminding His people of who He is. At first glance this might seem odd; I mean God is, well God, why does He have to define who He is? The answer for the Israelites was that they were learning, they did not know much about YHWH, so as He was making for Himself a people He needed to reveal Himself in powerful ways. This was especially true as the Israelites faced difficult times and challenges, God is continually reminding them that they can trust Him, because He is God.

As those who follow the ultimate revelation of God, Jesus Christ, we need to be reminded of this same truth today, the truth that God is, well God, so He can be trusted. As the culture around us is quickly embracing the ways of the world it can become very easy for us not to be still, which actually makes the call to be still and trust that God is in control as important as ever. The headlines are overwhelming and the temptation is to get so caught up in all that is going on that we forget the truth that the God we serve is sovereign over all.

This fall we will be spending 5 weeks working our way through the book of 1 Peter learning what it is like to live as exiles in a foreign land as we answer the fundamental question of how does a disciple of Jesus live in a world like ours? In order to answer this question we will focus on how disciples of Jesus can live faithful lives in the midst of a culture that is fundamentally opposed to the truths of our faith. In 1 Peter we are given a great example of what it means to live as strangers, as those who have been exiled into a very different land. What we will learn will challenge us, but it might be exactly what disciples of Jesus need to hear today.

As we enjoy these last few weeks of summer I pray that you will be encouraged by the truth that God is in control and because that is the truth, we can rest in that truth and simply be still.

Wine, Women & Song

In September I will be a member of WLC for 28 years! Many of you reading this know my faith grew up here. I remember I wanted to learn and grow and I wanted to be like women I saw at church. I wanted to be like Jane Dibbern, Mavis Shriver, Pat Stevens, Judy Van-Overbeke, Joy Hopke, Peggy Lund and Ruth Wessman (there were others) and of course, Rhoda Pfotenhauer. Rhoda and I spent many hours together while I poured out my heart trying to heal and know God. I'm sure there were times she tired of my sad stories, but she never showed it. Pastor Paul consistently listened, encouraged me and pointed me to God's love. When I think of the early years on the path, they were my spiritual mentors and 'Stephen Ministers.'

At the time there were three controversial topics – Wine, Women and Song. Wine at communion is the blood of Christ. Jesus said so. This truth can be controversial. Song represents worship styles (yes the debate is decades old and likely will exist until Jesus comes again.) The Women reference refers to the boundaries that are in place for women serving in some roles. One of those boundaries was serving communion; until very recently only elders and pastors could serve communion at the VC campus. Then finally it happened, the timing was right and women were included. Just a few months ago I was served by a woman, a friend. As our eyes met that first time they filled with tears. It was joyful, beautiful and healing.

The funny thing is you would think I would have been the first to enlist! But for some reason I hesitated. I didn't understand why I didn't jump in, until a few weeks ago. I was in the lobby on a Sunday morning and Scott Stevens asked if I was trained to be a communion assistant. I told him no. "Well, would you like to be?" And so I was trained right then and there.

I was a bit nervous as I began – I even forgot to say anything to the first person I offered the bread to. From there on it became more and more comfortable... "The body of Christ broken for you," I repeated. That phrase inside me went from my mind wanting to be sure to say it "right" to it becoming a prayer and then after that to praising God like a song in my heart. When we finished, we communed together at the altar and then covered the bread and wine. I took a moment to look at who I served with, Mr. Morton, who recently helped me in need, Mr. Stevens, a man I've respected and *Rhoda*. We stood at the altar together, serving shoulder to shoulder. I have grown through her mentoring just like the students of Rabbis in the time of the Last Supper.

God has placed me here in this place just like he did you. He placed me in the lobby that Sunday. He placed Rhoda there, too. The reason for my hesitation serving as a communion assistant was clear; there was a purpose for the wait. It was written by God way back when I didn't know Old from New Testament. He knew one day Rhoda and I would experience this together and I believe He smiled when we did. What an awesome God we have. I will hold this in my heart.

And one more thing, thank you to all the women and men who have taught me all along.

A fortress is a highly protected and impenetrable building—a stronghold in battle. Martin Luther penned the words, “A mighty fortress is our God, a bulwark never failing.” (A bulwark is a fortified wall, like a dam, that would hold back whatever would seek to invade). Long before that, the psalmist penned Psalm 91:2, “I will say of the LORD, ‘He is my refuge and my fortress, my God, in whom I trust.’” These writers knew the intimate peace of a protected place, a fortress that came from the protection of an Almighty God.

We have likely all had our living rooms disrupted by an architectural wonder made of chairs, blankets, and couch cushions, a fort where our kids can hide from the snares of cleaning their rooms and feel the close belonging of those invited into the space.

This month, we’d like to encourage you to build a family fort as a place to hide away and pray. It can be something you create in your living room with blankets and pillows or you may choose to create an outdoor fort following the directions on the next page.

As you build your physical fort and create a quiet and protected place to meet with God, discuss how the protection of God as our fortress makes you feel. Do you feel safe? Protected? Hidden?

Consider these occasions when you might come to your fortress to pray:

WHEN YOU NEED REST

- Psalm 91:1 declares, “Whoever dwells in the shelter of the Most High will rest in the shadow of the Almighty.” Sometimes the intimacy of a fort allows rest, and God encourages us to find our rest in Him. Pray for peace and rest when you feel weary.

WHEN YOU FEEL AFRAID

- Psalm 91:4-5 comforts us with, “He will cover you with his feathers, and under his wings

you will find refuge; his faithfulness will be your shield and rampart. You will not fear the terror of night, nor the arrow that flies by day.” God will keep us safe from that which we fear, covering us and giving us refuge. Confess your fears to God and trust Him as a strong fortress.

WHEN YOU FEEL THREATENED

- Psalm 91:9-10 says, “If you say, ‘The LORD is my refuge,’ and you make the Most High your dwelling, no harm will overtake you, no disaster will come near your tent.” Tell God when you feel threatened by harm or disaster, and declare Him as your refuge.

WHEN YOU NEED REASSURANCE

- Psalm 91 ends with verses 14-16, “‘Because he loves me,’ says the LORD, ‘I will rescue him; I will protect him, for he acknowledges my name. He will call on me, and I will answer him; I will be with him in trouble, I will deliver him and honor him. With long life I will satisfy him and show him my salvation.’” These verses encourage us to declare our love for God and to call on Him. God will be with us, deliver us, and honor us, and ultimately show His salvation. These verses say, “I know God and I am known by God.”

“God is our fortress” means we know Him as both intimate protector who covers us, and Almighty God who fights against our enemy.
