Let's remember what the challenge IS and IS NOT.

- It's NOT about "getting it all done" or "doing it right"! There is so much grace! It IS about what you are experiencing along the way, what you learn about God and yourself as you walk through this.
- It's NOT about killing yourself to stay caught up. It IS about creating space to sit with Jesus...to read, reflect and actually do the challenge.

If you fall behind, DON'T GIVE UP. Go to today and start fresh. If some of the challenges are hard or uncomfortable, pay attention to that. Talk to Jesus about this. Do some writing and reflecting.

Following Jesus is not passive, it's actively seeking Him, receiving from Him and learning to listen and respond to him. He is always leading us to deeper surrender to His ways and His purposes. It's about building our lives around a relationship with Him, not doing our religious duty.

I love Zack's words in the RLC intro..."By putting the God's words literally into practice, you will find the life God has made for you. Do you hear the invitation? And do you hear the challenge? That's how we grow...Invitation and Challenge or Grace and Truth. Jesus's words to us in Luke 11:28 "Blessed rather are those who hear the word of God and obey it". "

We're learning to follow Jesus together! DON'T GIVE UP!

Red Letter Challenge!

"But even more blessed are all who hear the word of God and put it into practice." - Luke 11:28

As I write this we are headed into the third week of The Red Letter Challenge, I am so excited that we have given away all 1500 copies of the book and that we are a gathering of Jesus followers who are actively seeking to become more like Jesus! At the heart of the RLC is the call that Jesus gives us to take His words and put them into practice, Jesus is constantly inviting us to be with Him so that we can take what He teaches us and actually do it, imagine that! If you are anything like me than you are a list person, I don't usually write them down, but I always have a list of things that I have to get done in my mind. If I am not really carful I can easily view my relationship with Jesus this same way, as a task or a checklist of things that I have to get done, instead of an invitation to come and abide with Him, so that I can get things done for Him!

I was very much struck by our second message in this series, entitled, "Being." If you missed it the point was that Jesus is going to ask us to do lots of things for

Him; but the truth is if we are going to be effective in our doing for Jesus then we have to understand that everything we do must flow first out of being with Him. We said it this way, "Our Doing always flows out of our Being."

What does that mean to you? What does it

mean to be with Jesus? In the RLC we were introduced to some very practical practices or disciplines that help us to do exactly this, to be with Jesus. As I made my way through the practices I was again reminded of four truths:

- 1. Anyone can be with Jesus the practices are not rocket science.
- 2. It is hard to find time in the busyness of our lives to be with Jesus.
- 3. It is always worth it to take the time to be with Jesus.
- 4. 4If you miss a day it is not the end of the world, these are called practices for a reason; we need to practice them.

I would like to challenge you to consider making these practices a regular part of your lives. The beauty of becoming more like Jesus is that whether you have been following Him for many years or just a few days the invitation to grow is a lifelong invitation. The time is now to hear the Word of God, so that we can put it into practice.

Feed My Starving Children MobilePack

272,000 meals in 18 hours. Enough food to feed 764 hungry children one meal a day for an entire year. That is what Woodbury Lutheran has committed to do as we once again partner with Feed My Starving Children (FMSC) to attack hunger around the world. FMSC estimates that 6,200 children die each day from undernutrition. That figure should shock and dismay us all. As followers of Christ, we are called to do what we can to change this reality.

On May 2nd, 3rd and 4th you, along with 1,000 of your friends, neighbors and fellow church members, will have the opportunity to participate in a FMSC packing event to be held at our Valley Creek campus. Adults and children will measure and scoop ingredients, seal bags and prepare boxes for shipping. Children as young as five can also help as long as they are with their parents. If you are a leader of an organization that would like to participate (Scouts, etc.) then the minimum age is third grade. For more information on adult to student ratio for groups, please contact Liz Thompson (651-262-9665).

FMSC is a Christian nonprofit organization dedicated to seeing every child and person around the world healthy, nourished and whole in body and spirit. Their approach is simple: children and adults hand-pack meals, MannaPackTM Rice, formulated specifically for malnourished children. Organizations in nearly 70 countries around the world distribute these meals to children in greatest need. In 2017-18, FMSC sent 333 million meals around the world thanks to the work of more than 1.2 million volunteers. FMSC is able to spend more than 90% of total donations directly on feeding children because of its volunteers. And 99.8% of its meals are securly delivered!

120 individuals are needed at each of the 9, 2-hour shifts, while 10 adults are needed to help set-up on May 2nd and clean-up on May 4th. You can register yourself, your family and friends and/or your organization at **FMSC.org** or via the link on WLC's home page. The available shifts are:

Thursday, May 2nd:
 6-8 pm, with set-up from 3-5 pm

Friday, May 3rd:
 9:30-11:30 am, 12:30-2:30 pm, 3-5 pm, 6-8 pm
 Saturday, May 4th:
 Same as Friday with clean-up from 8-10 pm

A couple of items to note once you have completed your registration:

- Please arrive 10-minutes prior to the start of your shift for registration and training
- Please wear closed-toed shoes (no sandals or flip-flops)
- Please leave your jewerly at home

While we will be helping FMSC in their mission, we will also be fulfilling several of the goals of our church including broadening our church's understanding and practice of generosity and modeling Christ's love by meeting the basic needs of others. While serving students from three years of age through eighth grade, it constantly works to educate and encourage children and families from diverse backgrounds, socioeconomic statuses, ethnicities, nationalities, and even beliefs.

"At Trinity First kids work hard" is a phrase often heard from students and teachers in the halls and classrooms. Trinity First firmly believes in giving God their best by providing top-notch education and instruction to all students and families. It is a place that values prayer, relationships, inclusive education, family involvement, servanthood, integrity and excellence. By embodying these values, the students, families, and staff all demonstrate the importance of being productive citizens not only here in their day to day lives on earth, but also as faithful citizens of God's Kingdom.

This summer there is a special opportunity for us at Woodbury to get involved. Each summer the Trinity First students participate in three weeks of summer school called Summer Bridge to Success. What to PRAY about? Here are 3 ideas - feel free to pray as you're led:

- 1. For our missionaries' relationships with Jesus to grow deeper
- 2. For the message of Jesus to be clearly proclaimed in and through their words and lives
- 3. For good health for them and their families

MODELING IDENTITY

As a parent you are the first role model for your children. When they're younger they will look to you to know how to become kind, respectful, and generous and how to love others. As your children grow, they will come to you for advice on things such as time management, finances, and making good decisions. From the moment you become a parent, someone is watching you to learn what it means to live in God-given identity. No pressure, right?

We live in a world where false identities constantly barrage us—through social media, our friends, our family, and even ourselves. It's easy to feel "blown and tossed by the wind" as we chase after this role or that thing to fulfill our deep needs for meaning and satisfaction (James 1:6).

How do we ground ourselves? The best way I know to combat false identity is to fill my heart with God's Word and let His voice be louder than anyone else's. When I still myself and allow the Creator to tell me who He's made me to be, I naturally begin to live differently. Things that once hindered me and made me insecure lose power as I remind myself daily of my true identity: I am loved, protected, and known by the one true God.

As a parent, when you make space to hear your heavenly Father speak identity over you, you begin to overflow with truth and model to your children who God says you are—and tell them who they are from a place of integrity!

On the following page you will find an easy and fun illustration to help you communicate this truth to your children.

WHAT YOU'LL NEED

- · water
- · tall, clear vase
- waterproof tray
- · ping-pong balls
- · permanent marker


WHAT YOU'LL DO

- Together as a family, talk about some false identities or labels the world or people around you may offer (your worth comes from being the best, having money, being beautiful, being smart, etc. If you aren't, the world may offer labels like dumb, ugly, weak, not good enough. You may then tell yourself you are worthless, unseen, unlovable).
- 2. Have each member of your family write a false identity he struggles with on a ping-pong ball. If your children are young, you can have them color the balls black and talk about lies the enemy may want people to believe.
- 3. Remind your children that our true identity comes from our Creator–God. It is very important to read His Word to find out who He says we are.
- 4. Put the vase on the tray and place the ping-pong balls in the vase; explain that the vase represents our hearts.
- 5. Begin to fill the vase up with water.

- 6. Tell your children, "When we read God's Word it fills up our hearts with truth."
- 7. Fill the vase up so the false identities (ping-pong balls) begin to fall out.
- 8. Explain to your children that when our hearts are full of our God-given identity there's no room for false identities.
- 9. Remind them that we are human so we can forget who God says we are and believe something different even after we claim our identity in Christ. Put one of the ping-pong balls (false identities) on top of the water in the vase. Tell your children that since we've engraved who our heavenly Father says we are in our hearts, identities that aren't congruent can only rest on the surface temporarily—until we remember or read more of God's truth about us.
- 10. When we remember who God says we are and live in that confidence, others will see Christ in our lives.
