As we begin to journey through 2018 and the first of two years in our *Multiply* initiative, I wanted to share a few thoughts and observations with you. At WLC we have had several capital campaigns over the years and they all have helped to move our church forward in some significant ways, but never once did we reach the financial goal of the campaign, we always came up a little short.

I am so excited that we have 477 pledges towards Multiply. When you take the amount pledged along with the expected giving over the next two years we are on pace to blow away our goal of \$8.4 million dollars and be closer to \$9 million dollars. Of course the work is just starting and now we have to follow through on where God is leading us. To help us stay on track you will notice a few things over the coming weeks and months:

1. We will keep you updated on how things are going and what is being accomplished on a weekly, monthly and quarterly basis through a variety of platforms. Expect to see updates in the bulletin, in worship, in newsletters, in special mail-

ings and in videos.

2. Remember that *Multi-ply* is one fund, meaning that everything we do ministry wise is included in Multiply. We are working hard at understanding the best way to use the resources that God is blessing

us with and know that we will be conservative and flexible in our approach as we apply funds in:

MULTISITE INVESTMENT

- \$1.1 Million

We will be proactive in using the blessings God has given us to multiply new campuses for His glory.

FOCUSED MISSIONS - \$1.1 Million

We will support the work of God's Kingdom by multiplying new church plants and leaders, partnering with developing communities and feeding the hungry.

TRANSFORMATIONAL MINISTRIES - \$4.5 Million

We will be faithful to the ongoing ministry of WLC so disciples will be multiplied and lives transformed.

FOUNDATIONAL EXPENSES - \$1.7 Million

We will accelerate the payment of debt and make needed investments in our facilities so that we can effectively say "yes" to what God has in store for our future.

The History of Our Church WLC Scrapbook

Fifty years ago, in a township far, far from Ottawa, Canada, a new church was chartered within the Lutheran Church - Missouri Synod. Here is how the story unfolded:

1965 – Our synod purchases five acres of land on Valley Creek Road in the Township of Woodbury.

- At that time, Woodbury has a population of 5000, but substantial growth is forecast.
- There is nothing but pasture on the lot. An old house sits next door on Queens Drive.
- · No church building will be constructed until 1969.

1967 – Pastor Paul Pfotenhauer and his wife Rhoda are called to plant a new church in Woodbury.

- They leave their church in Ottawa, Canada, and drive their aging car to Woodbury, Minnesota.
- As they drive across the St. Croix River, they place their success firmly in God's hands.
- Young Pastor Paul spends the summer and fall canvassing the nearby neighborhoods.
- His car leaks oil. His Mickey Mouse watch grabs attention. His personality is warm.
- The first church service is held on November 5th at Royal Oaks Elementary School.
- The church has no name yet. 150 people attend.

1968 – Articles of Incorporation are adopted in January by the new church council.

- Almost a hundred charter members are welcomed into the new church.
- · A church is born!



Ministry Planning Team Begins Work on Long-Range Ministry Plan

It's the start of a new year and the start of our next 50 years at WLC. We begin this new year with thankful hearts for God's blessing on His ministry among us. As good stewards of those blessings the Church Council has chartered a team to update our long-range ministry plan. With our Mission, Vision, Values and Discipleship Path as our guide, the team will work together with the congregation, staff and the Pastors to discern God's leading and set goals for the next 5-7 years.

With Scripture as our foundation and in a posture of humility, commitment, and trust the Ministry Planning Team will:

- Conduct an assessment of all current ministries
- Perform a congregational survey (REVEAL for Multi-site) and individual ministry input sessions
- Evaluate community demographics, and research ministry trends to identify focus areas and new ministry opportunities
- Utilize task forces to assess options for the St. Croix campus and next generation Multi-site ministry
- Develop overall and individual ministry level SMART goals
- Complete a long-range budget, staffing plan, and facilities plan to support achievement of our goals

Members of the team include John Foster (chair), Charlie Wesser, Renee Boehme, Kim Hughes, Joel Symmank, Mark Stutelberg, Pastor Jon, Pastor Tom, and Vicar Christian.

To launch this effort, **we invite you to join in the process** by completing the Reveal Spiritual Health Survey online. This is the same survey we completed in 2009 as part of our last ministry planning process and it has now been updated for multi-site churches. The survey goes live on Sunday, February 4th and is available for two weeks. We need everyone to join in and share their insights!

Why Camp Cherith?

I have recently read a book called, "Start with Why." The basic premise of the book is that companies starting with their "why" are much more successful than companies starting with their "what" and "how." Southwest Airlines is an excellent example of this. Have you seen their recent commercial with the tagline, "You are free to move about the country." Believe it or not, that is their "whv."

Southwest Airlines entered the airline industry in the 1970's when the market was already competitive and only 15% of Americans traveled by plane. That didn't matter to them because they weren't going after the 15%; they were going after the other 85%. Had vou asked Southwest in the 1970's who their competition was, they would have told you cars and buses. Their "why' is clear, they wanted to make airline travel affordable for the average Joe. Southwest has and still is the most profitable airline and this all begs a question:

what is Camp Cherith's "why?"

Why do we exist, why do we have staff that drive three hours north for minimal pay or no pay at all to hang out with over 600 campers every summer? Why do we wake up at 7am for our staff meetings, followed by a full day serving campers, until finally we lay our heads on our pillow at 11pm totally exhausted? Then we actually wake up the next morning and do it all over again, and again, and again, all summer long! Some staff work for only one week and at the end of their service they drive three hours back to the city, calling each other on the phone so they don't fall asleep at the wheel. WHY?

Our WHY: "Christ in every phase of life." We believe that providing campers an outstanding experience filled with laughter, fun, and solid biblical teaching can change their life forever. We believe that if campers make a decision to put their trust in Christ and commit their life to

him, Christ will seep into every part of their life. We believe that Christ brings forgiveness, healing, power, and wisdom that will be a light unto our camper's path and lamp unto their feet. We believe in "Christ in every phase of life."

On behalf of the many staff and campers impacted every summer, we want to thank Woodbury Lutheran Church for your faithful generosity. Our camp would not be where it is today without you! Your support continues to create a great camping experience for kids so they can learn about a God that wants to be in every part of their life. CHIRST IN EVERY PHASE OF LIFE! "Dear God ..." It seems each of my kids' prayers, and often my own, begin with those two words. A pastor once challenged me to consider whom I pray to—is it always God the Father? Do I ever pray to Jesus? What about the Holy Spirit? How often do I picture a one-dimensional God when I pray, possibly mentioning His attributes but never calling Him by any other name?

To engage in prayer with God implies a certain level of knowing something about Him–knowing that you can trust Him with the words and thoughts you share in prayer and knowing that He hears the prayers you speak or write. Engaging in a rhythm of prayer with our kids and families has the potential to not only increase our knowledge of God's attributes but to influence our own identities in Christ and our understanding of how He interacts with the world.

In this month, when most of us are declaring our feelings of love, take the next 28 days to write prayers to God in the form of letters or notes. Set out paper or sticky notes and markers somewhere in your home along with a list of the following attributes and names of God, one for each letter of the alphabet. A good format to follow is to address God by the name for that day, thank Him for a way you have seen Him reveal that attribute in your life, and then direct any requests for yourself or others around that particular attribute. Finally, praise Him for who He is!



Prayer isn't just a Christian thing. People all over the world, religious or not, participate in prayer. But followers of Jesus are specifically called to pray by God. How then should we pray? Jesus' answer to that very question gives us a model for how to pray and opens us up to the wonderful experience of an intimate relationship with God.

Title: Teach Us to Pray

Reading: Luke II:I-4 Verse: Luke II:I 2nd Reading: John 20:II-20

Focus: Many of us have felt a deep desire to pray and want a strong prayer life. Yet, consistency and depth in prayer can be difficult. When Jesus' disciples asked for help with their own prayers, his response invited them to see prayer in a new light. Prayer begins not with what we say, but with knowing who we're talking to.

Focus: Holiness is not a common concept today. It's a term used to describe God—that he is perfect and set apart. Yet as Jesus dives into what prayer should look like, he invites his disciples to order their whole lives—and their prayer—around adoration of his holiness.

Title: Follow After
Reading: Matthew 6:5-13
Verse: Matthew 6:10

2nd Reading: Matthew 26:36-39,42

Focus: God is on his throne. He is reigning. Sometimes we just miss it or ignore it. But as Jesus continues to teach his disciples about prayer we are reminded that we were created to live under the direction of God's gracious rule and that part of praying means handing over the reins to the one in control of all things.

Title: Requests
Reading: Luke 11:1-13
Verse: Luke 11:3
2nd Reading: James 4:1-10

Focus: Many times we think of prayer as only asking God for things. When our requests don't get answered, we wonder why God isn't coming through. Yet Jesus doesn't turn to our requests until the middle of the Lord's Prayer, prompting us to rethink what it looks like to share our requests with God.

Title: Forgiveness
Reading: Matthew 6:5-13
Verse: Matthew 6:12
2nd Reading: I John 1:5-10

Focus: Confession and forgiveness are often associated with Christianity, but what does it look like to live a life of confession and forgiveness? As Jesus continues to teach his disciples how to pray he invites them to see that

Reading: Matthew 6:5-13
Verse: Matthew 6:13
2nd Reading: Matthew 21:1-13

Focus: What do we do when hard times come? We could respond by getting angry, feeling guilty, or remaining apathetic. But as Jesus closes the prayer he taught his disciples he invites them, and us, to see trials for what they really are and run to him for deliverance.
