The History of Our Church WLC Scrapbook

Following the adoption of the Articles of Incorporation in January 1968, the new church continued to meet in Royal Oaks Elementary School, not far from the land that had been purchased for the future church building. Here are some tidbits from that first year:

- The Lutheran Church Missouri Synod purchased a parsonage at 7217 Coachwood Road, literally around the corner from the school and land.
 - * Pastor Paul and Rhoda Pfotenhauer have now lived in this house for over 50 years.
- Sunday school, confirmation class and church choir met in the Coachwood house until the first sanctuary was built.
- Ours was a mission church, as confirmed by an earlier showing of the film "For Their Sake."
- From the Woodbury Lutheran Mission organizational meeting minutes: "The ladies adjourned to a separate room to discuss care of the altar, choir and choir robes, and welcome committee."
- In March, "a special meeting was held for the purpose of selecting a church name. During the first vote, Woodbury Lutheran Church received 15 votes, Lutheran Church of Woodbury 6 votes, and Glory of God Lutheran Church 16 votes. A re-vote was held. Woodbury Lutheran Church was selected by majority vote."
- Building plans: "The church sanctuary should be a space which is worshipful. It should not appear to be makeshift or temporary. It will most likely become a fellowship hall when the permanent larger sanctuary is built."
- In December, "Under the direction of Mrs. Esther Kasperson, an Adult

Choir meets periodically for rehearsal. Plans are underway to have this group sing for special occasions."

- By the end of the first full year, attendance was 200, with 70 children in Sunday school.
- Budget for 1968: \$17,187.
 Offerings: \$12,686.



An Update On Multiply

But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes upon you. And you will be my witnesses, telling people about me everywhere—in Jerusalem, throughout Judea, in Samaria, and to the ends of the earth." -

2018 is off to a strong start financially around the *Multiply* initiative. Over the next several months we will be watching the finances closely looking for new trends in giving and so forth. As we do, it is important to remember that *Multiply* is a two year 8.4 million dollar initiative that includes everything in our budget. Remember *Multiply* is one fund, meaning that everything we do ministry wise is included in *Multiply*.

Here are a few updates from each bucket:

MULTISITE INVESTMENT - \$1.1 Million

We will be proactive in using the blessings God has given us to multiply new campuses for His glory.

- We continue to pay the operating expenses of Liberty Ridge and Oak Hill.
- We are setting aside funds for future multisite ministry as well as for a future permanent location for Liberty Ridge.

FOCUSED MISSIONS - \$1.1 Million

We will support the work of God's Kingdom by multiplying new church plants and leaders, partnering with developing communities and feeding the hungry.

- Our Reach initiatives led by Mike Sabbann and Regina Kehl are starting to take good shape. Both will be in Ethiopia this month to further explore church planting and pastoral training opportunities.
- Dean Dunavan will be starting into the SMP process in the fall.

TRANSFORMATIONAL MINISTRIES - \$4.5 Million

We will be faithful to the ongoing ministry of WLC so disciples will continue to be multiplied and transformed.

 We are excited about the significant planning process our staff is in, and we are developing a transition plan for Mark Shepperd's retirement in May.


FOUNDATIONAL EXPENSES - \$1.7 Million

We will accelerate the payment of debt and make needed investments in our facilities so that we can effectively say "yes" to what God has in store for our future.

- Our debt is now under 1.7 million dollars.
- The Valley Creek Sanctuary is currently being repainted and will also receive new carpet, lighting and the floors will be redone.
- A new monument sign has been installed on the Oak Hill Campus.

- Talk with people Start conversations. Listen to others and share your story.
- Do good Bless your neighbor.
- Minister through prayer Offer a simple prayer.

Celebrating 30 Years In Africa!

We are soon to celebrate thirty years in Africa. For two years now, we've been in Southern Africa, after having spent over 25 years in Cameroon, in the center of the continent. In these two years, we have learned the national language, and are excited to be embarking upon a more active ministry, now that we can communicate to those around us. Paula is learning a tribal, Bantu language, while we both also continue getting better at speaking and understanding the national language.

In March and April, we will be facilitating a seminar for around 15 people, all of whom have shown interest in reaching out to unreached people in their city. Every Saturday, we will travel across town to a small church building to teach 4 hours. The sessions will include a lot of activities like drama, small group work, and discussion in the large group. At the beginning of each Saturday morning, we'll be demonstrating a Bible study method that can easily be learned and used by working people who cannot read. Then, we'll be reviewing their practice of the ideas during the previous week.

We are still trying to make this seminar come alive. Pray for us as we continue to develop new dramas and new learning activities that will help people to understand how they can reach out to people from a different religion or culture.





PARENTS, ALTHOUGH THE SEASON OF LENT BEGAN ON FEBRUARY 14, IT IS NEVER TOO LATE TO BEGIN ENCOURAGING YOUR FAMILY TO PRACTICE DISCIPLINES THAT KEEP OUR FOCUS ON JESUS!

THE TRADITION OF LENT

And so, from the day we heard, we have not ceased to pray for you, asking that you may be filled with the knowledge of his will in all spiritual wisdom and understanding, so as to walk in a manner worthy of the Lord, fully pleasing to him: bearing fruit in every good work and increasing in the knowledge of God. (Colossians 1:9-10 ESV)

Lent is a season of reflection and renewal for the 40 days leading up to Easter. Through spiritual practice and discipline, Lent prepares followers of Christ for the celebration of Christ's resurrection. Jesus Himself gave us an example of this when He spent 40 days and nights in the desert fasting, praying, and refusing to give in to Satan's temptations at the start of His ministry (Matthew 4:1-11).

Isn't it beautiful that in the tradition of Lent, we get to share in what our Lord and Savior practiced? The practice of Lent encourages us to slow down our busy lives and focus on our relationship with God. The three spiritual practices Jesus modeled in Matthew 4–fasting, prayer, and reflection on Scripture—are a great place for any family to begin. All of these disciplines create space for the focus to shift from self to God.

FASTING

Fasting often refers to a restricted diet related to food. During Lent, many people practice fasting from food—giving up sweets, soda, or coffee. But fasting can also be a practice to forfeit TV time, FaceBook, social apps, eating out, or going to the movies. Fasting is not meant to harm or punish. Rather, the absence of those things is to make time to spend with God in prayer or Scripture reading.

PRAYER

Many of us think of prayer as our conversation with God—sharing with Him our troubles, celebrations, and petitions. If you are going to focus on prayer for the 40 days of Lent,

challenge yourself to do something different than you usually do. Perhaps spend time in prayer for others and write them notes telling them you prayed for them. Start a prayer journal as a family, leaving it where any family member can add to it. Create a physical space for family members to practice listening for God. This can be a small space in your home with a simple Scripture verse to repeat aloud before praying.

SCRIPTURE

Jesus grew up hearing and learning the Scriptures He used to defeat Satan in the desert. As a family, read together and memorize Scriptures that focus on the character of God, which can be an encouragement to you when tempted.

God Is Merciful-Ephesians 2:4

God Is Gracious-Romans 1:5

God Is Love-Deuteronomy 7:7-8

God Is Trustworthy-Numbers 23:19

God Is Wise-Romans 11:33

Easter Sunday brings closure to the 40 days of Lent, celebrating the resurrection of the Savior promised in Genesis. Jesus fulfilled every prophecy and promise God told His children throughout the Old Testament. Praise be to God!




