

# The History of Our Church WLC Scrapbook

After the first sanctuary and education wing were completed in the fall of 1969, the new Woodbury church continued to grow and thrive. By 1979, there were approximately 800 baptized members supporting an annual budget of \$84,000.

- 1980 An addition to the original building was dedicated on April 20.
  This expanded the structure to the west with the Fireside Room, some
  offices, a fellowship hall and a kitchen. The parking lot was on the
  east side of the building.
- :) The Fireside Room has a fireplace only because Pastor Paul said to Jack Lavers one night, "You have been chosen to build a fireplace in the fireside room. It must be stone just like the one you have built here in your home... And by the way, we have no funds to build it. You need to get the rocks for it and it needs to be completed within 90 days." [Story in July 2017 newsletter]
- :) Pat and Roy Kyndberg moved across the street from the Pfotenhauers almost 50 years ago. It wasn't long before their home became

known as the Parsonage of the North. Pat was the first PAID church secretary. Roy was active in church affairs.

1985 - Encouraged by Pastor Paul, a group of members led by Margie and Paul Jones created four stained alass windows the original sanctu-Margie was an art teacher who knew little about stained alass. She and Beth Petrowski incorporated a white piece of glass in each window design to represent Christ's purity and holiness. [Story in Au*aust 2017 newsletter*]







# An Update On Multiply

2018 is off to a strong start financially around the *Multiply* initiative. Over the next several months we will be watching the finances closely looking for new trends in giving and so forth. As we do, it is important to remember that *Multiply* is a two year 8.4 million dollar initiative that includes everything in our budget. Remember *Multiply* is one fund, meaning that everything we do ministry wise is included in *Multiply*. Here are a few updates from each bucket:

#### **MULTISITE INVESTMENT - \$1.1 Million**

We will be proactive in using the blessings God has given us to multiply new campuses for His glory.

- We continue to pay the operating expenses of Liberty Ridge and Oak Hill.
- We are setting aside funds for future multisite ministry as well as for a future permanent location for Liberty Ridge.

#### **FOCUSED MISSIONS - \$1.1 Million**

We will support the work of God's Kingdom by multiplying new church plants and leaders, partnering with developing communities and feeding the hungry.

- Mike Sabbann and Regina Kehl just returned from Ethiopia where they
  were exploring opportunities for us to partner with the Makane Yesus
  Lutheran Church body, specifically in the areas of church planting and
  leader development.
- Dean Dunavan will be starting into the SMP (Specific Ministry Pastor) process in the fall.
- We were able to write a check to Feed My Starving Children for 50K.
- We are busy prepping for summer short term mission experiences.

#### **TRANSFORMATIONAL MINISTRIES - \$4.5 Million**

We will be faithful to the ongoing ministry of WLC so disciples will continue to be multiplied and transformed.



# A Garden of Memories

In April, we usually think of showers bringing May flowers, and if we are lucky maybe a few earlier. Not this year, only more snow. So, where's the flowers? They are on the south side of the church, by the drive through. How did they get there? That's an interesting story.

April 5, marked 10 years since my dad, Ray, entered heaven. My dad, a retired civil engineer, grew up on a small farm and loved to garden. He and my mom, Arline, i.e. "Spike", had a hobby farm in Welch where my dad decided to try raising grapes. He became a successful grower of Minnesota grapes and a charter member of Northern Vineyard Winery in Stillwater.

My dad loved ushering at church and when he passed, my mom asked Pastor Dean, "where could the church use his memorial funds"? Pastor Dean had a couple of ideas, but the one that seemed to fit well was a flower garden. At the time, the south side of the church was just grass and a couple trees. Not much to view. So together with funds from the church, a landscape architect was hired to develop and implement a plan. The plan would incorporate some of my dad's favorite plants...including a Minnesota grape arbor. These plants included a blue spruce, flowering crabs, amur maples, Russian sage, mugho pines, tiger lilies, mums, daisies, burning bush, spirea, barberry and Seval grapes. An existing maple, was also incorporated in the plan. Unfortunately, the daisies haven't survived the local rabbits! In the early days of the garden, my 82-year-old mother kept a close eye on it's progress, including pulling weeds and pruning when needed. Today, our custodial staff has it well under control.

I feel the garden has significantly improved the staff view as well as the neigh-

bors and visitors to the church. The arbor is also a perfect spot for that first wedding shot - but not in April.

As for weddings, in April, Renee and I celebrated 39 years of marriage and membership at Woodbury Lutheran. We have seen many changes over that time. We also have been blessed to raise three girls here, whose hearts for missions were inspired by this church's youth leaders and pastors, as well as their college pastor. Danielle and Cortney are or have served as college missionaries at UMD.

The garden is now another piece of church history and will always be a reminder, not only of my dad, but that spring will eventually come, and His creations will always bloom.

# **Actively Bringing the Gospel**

Thank you for helping bring the Gospel to people in our own backyard and across the world!

If you were to visit Pastor Demelash Yoseph's Oromo speaking church in St. Paul a few years ago, you would have noticed around 20-30 people there in worship. If you were to make a similar visit to their church on any given Sunday night now you might take notice that the worship attendance has not changed much. What you may not realize is that this powerhouse of mission has also started 22 other churches in the last 5 years by raising up leaders from within and sending them out!

This year alone, in partnership with LINC Twin Cities, Pastor Demelash and their ministry called OELMS (Oromo Ethiopian Lutheran Mission Society) are starting multiple churches in Minnesota and around the world!

Some of us had the privilege of seeing their global impact on a recent trip to Ethiopia. Alongside of Regina Kehl, Mike Sabbann and Connie Sabbann; Pastor Demelash introduced us to a church in their network that is actively multiplying and bringing the Gospel to a predominantly Muslim community.

We were also blessed to see first hand the wonderful work that is happening at the school in Sendafa that so many at Woodbury Lutheran have poured into. We saw the vibrant Gospel centered work happening there and the tangible impact that is being made! One particular heart melting moment was witnessing Regina connect with the children she sponsors. Such love.

Years ago, Pastor Demelash was forced to leave Ethiopia because of death threats received in response to his popular radio program. Now, not only does he lead a local church and mentor new church starting pastors, but he also records a Gospel television program that is broadcast on the MOA network throughout Eastern Africa and the Middle East. The estimated reach of this channel is over 50 million people. While visiting the studio we heard reports of people responding to his program for prayer including someone from within Saudi Arabia.

God has been moving among our Ethiopian brothers and sisters. Right here in the Twin Cities there are over 40,000 Oromo Ethiopians and roughly 85% of them are Muslim. Praise God for Pastor Demelash Yoseph and others who are actively bringing the Gospel to our own backyard and around the world!

## Five Million Meals

Mark your calendar for the Feed My Starving Children MobilePack October 4-7 – registration opens August 4th.

Once again, Woodbury Lutheran is joining volunteers from around the Woodbury community to pack meals for the hungry at the largest-ever FMSC event under one roof at the HealthEast Sports Center. Two years ago, the Woodbury community packed 4 million meals for hungry children in 7 countries and donated 10 percent of the funds raised to the local Christian Cupboard Emergency Food Shelf. We need your help to reach our goal this year of 5 million meals and once again contributing 10 percent of the funds to the CCEFS.

We are putting the call out for individuals interested in becoming a Certified Volunteer (CV). CVs will be responsible for assisting FMSC staff with creating a seamless packing experience for each of the estimated 20,000 volunteers that will be coming through the doors. CVs will join with FMSC staff in ensuring that the meals are packed efficiently, while upholding FMSC's policies and procedures. There will be a training for those interested in becoming a CV on October 3rd at 6 pm at the HealthEast Sports Center.

CVs will be responsible for helping with event setup and cleanup (if possible) and general cleaning throughout the event; answering general questions; and being additional hands and feet for the FMSC staff. CVs are being asked to work at least two 5-hour shifts (2 packing sessions per shift). We are not asking for a definite commitment at this time, we are only asking interested parties to put their name on a list for contact later this summer. # Botswana Meet the Translators

On Tuesday, March 13 my wife Connie and I were sitting in a small steel-roofed office in the village of Shakawe, in northwest Botswana. The fan in the room kept the air moving, but it was still hot and very humid. We were listening to two villagers talk excitedly about their jobs – translating the Bible into the language of their people, the Khwe (pronounced quay). These two men, named Splash (age 40) and Moronga (24), work closely with Pastor Tim Beckendorf, a missionary that WLC supports financially.

In 2005, the Botswana Bible Society invited Tim (through Lutheran Bible Translators) to the country for the specific purpose of developing an alphabet and written language for the Khwe people. This people group has always only had an oral language.

Recall Jesus' words to His disciples "Go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them ... and teaching them to obey everything I taught you" (Matthew 28:19-20). Pastor Tim and his family are among the few who actually "go".

Imagine your own spiritual life, your growth as a disciple if you didn't have your Bible. What about the faith of others in your family if there wasn't the written Word? I think we can be glad that our church is working to bring the good news about Jesus to the Khwe people, helping to fulfill the Great Commission. Your generosity allows WLC to Multiply Disciples and Transform lives, not just here in the Twin Cities, but even as far

away as Botswana! Thank you.

# SPIRITUAL MOTHER'S DAY CARDS

Did you know the roots of Mother's Day date back to the 19th century? In the years before the Civil War, Ann Reeves Jarvis of West Virginia helped start "Mother's Day Work Clubs" to teach local women how to properly care for their children.

The official Mother's Day holiday arose in the 1900s as a result of the efforts of Anna Jarvis, daughter of Ann Reeves Jarvis. Following her mother's 1905 death, Anna Jarvis envisioned Mother's Day as a way of honoring the sacrifices mothers make for their children.

After gaining financial backing from a Philadelphia department store owner named John Wanamaker, in May 1908 she organized the first official Mother's Day celebration at a Methodist church in Grafton, West Virginia. That same day, thousands of people attended a Mother's Day event at one of Wanamaker's retail stores in Philadelphia.

Following the success of her first Mother's Day, Jarvis—who remained unmarried and childless her whole life—resolved to see her holiday added to the national calendar. Arguing that American holidays were biased toward male achievements, she started a massive letter-writing campaign to newspapers and prominent politicians urging the adoption of a special day honoring motherhood.

By 1912 many states, towns, and churches had adopted Mother's Day as an annual holiday, and Jarvis had established the Mother's Day International Association to help promote her cause. Her persistence paid off in 1914 when President Woodrow Wilson signed a measure officially establishing the second Sunday in May as Mother's Day.<sup>1</sup>

#### MOTHER'S DAY AROUND THE WORLD

While versions of Mother's Day are celebrated worldwide, traditions vary depending on the country. In Thailand, for example, Mother's Day is always celebrated in August on the birthday of the current queen, Sirikit.

Another observance of Mother's Day can be found in Ethiopia, where families gather each fall to sing songs and eat a large feast as part of Antrosht, a multi-day celebration honoring motherhood.

In the United States, Mother's Day continues to be a day to present mothers and other women with gifts and flowers, and it has become one of the biggest holidays for consumer spending. Families also celebrate by giving mothers a day off from activities such as cooking or other household chores.

This Mother's Day, consider celebrating those mothers and grandmothers in your faith community who have invested in your life. Encourage your children to join you in thinking of women whose testimonies have displayed God's faithfulness, grace, and wisdom.
