The names Bev Manship and Laurel Mills probably ring familiar when you think of Operation Christmas Child. They have been serving as Collection Site Coordinators at Woodbury Lutheran and kept the process of collecting boxes running smoothly for years. From organizing people to ensuring supplies were stocked for volunteers and coordinating the collection of thousands of boxes from area drop-off sites surrounding Woodbury, Bev and Laurel have been such a blessing to our church, our community, and Operation Christmas Child. Please join us in thanking these amazing ladies for the dedicated service and countless hours spent to make a smooth process for our church and the many who have dropped off boxes at Woodbury Lutheran. At this time, they will be stepping out of this role.

Some of you may be wondering what this might mean for dropping off boxes.

With the stepping down of our coordinators and learning that Operation Christmas Child will be moving its distribution center to Chicago (from Minneapolis) in 2019, Woodbury Lutheran's Oak Hill Campus will continue to be a Drop-Off Site; however, the Valley Creek Campus will no longer be a Central Drop-Off location or a Drop-Off Site. This simply means all boxes can be dropped off at Oak Hill or another Drop-Off Site. Here are a couple in our area.

Want or Need?

"Do not be like them (the Pagans), for your Father knows what you need before you ask him." -- Matthew 6:8

Somewhere along the line I picked up the learning that there is a big difference between a *want* and a *need*. Most likely this came out of my experience of growing up in a middle class family in the United States of America where it can be really easy to mix up a *want* for a *need*. Just the other day, I was watching T.V. with Peyten when a commercial came on for some kind of Minnie Mouse item and she looked at me and blurted out, "Dad I need that!"

In Matthew 6, Jesus is teaching us about wants and needs and He encourages us not to worry about the things of the world (even though we need them to survive). like what we will eat and what we will drink and what we will wear. It is not that those things are bad, in fact we need them, but Jesus is teaching that there is something more important that we *need*, mainly seeking after His Kingdom first. In an interesting twist, Jesus teaches that if we seek after Him the one thing we really **need**, than the other stuff (that we need to live) will be given as well.

This teaching of Jesus has me thinking about the purpose for our

church. Sure, we have a clearly defined vison and we have values that have developed over our 50 years that guide our life together and all of that is really important, but at the heart of the role of church is giving us not what we want, but what

we **need**, and what we **need** is the truth and grace of Jesus. The church is functioning when Jesus and His Kingdom are present and proclaimed (not when we are getting everything we **want**), because that is what we **need**, after all we are sick sinners in need of a doctor.

As we continue to navigate change and transition in our church, there will be things that you love and things that don't like very much, but those things will always fit into the wants category. That doesn't mean those wants are not important, but the promise of Jesus is that when we seek after what is most important He will meet all of our needs along the way, wow what a glorious promise!

As the person who God has placed into the role of Senior Pastor at WLC, my promise to you is that I will always do my very best to give you exactly what you **need**, Jesus and His Kingdom, because I will fall short of giving you everything you **want**. I want to invite you to come with me and seek after His Kingdom together, because as we seek Jesus and His Kingdom we are promised that He will meet every one of our needs and probably a whole lot of **wants** along the way as well:).

The Valley Creek campus has become a very busy place over the past 50 years. The VC building is open from 7 AM until 9 PM, seven days a week, and is the site of dozens of classes, programs and meetings. It is estimated that there are as many as 100 separate activities that take place in our church each month, besides the five weekly worship services. Oak Hill has also become a building that is used by the community.

The older section of the Valley Creek facility is occupied by the Woodbury Lutheran Pre-School on weekdays. Bible studies and church meetings take place throughout the week at both campuses. 
This Training Will Change Your Neighbor's Life!

Does God Really Care About ALL People?

The Bible says that God wants to draw people from every tribe, tongue, and nation into a personal relationship with Himself. That certainly includes those of us who live in the Twin Cities, the ones who go to church, right? But really, what's that mean for remote Paraguayan farmers, Mongolian tribespeople, Muslim housewives in Kazakhstan, and Karen people living in St. Paul? Does He really want them to know Him, and if so, how's He going about doing it - in real life?

Beginning in January, WLC will host the class **Perspectives on the World Christian Movement**. It offers a paradigm shift in thinking for the average believer who sits in Church every week. This 15-week course provides a glimpse into God's redemptive story as the Creator of the Universe, and how, since the beginning of time. He has pursued His children. Through the materials and speakers provided in this course, students will begin to understand more broadly a Biblical, historical, and cultural view of all mankind and be greatly challenged to be a part of God's strategic plan in fulfilling the Great Commission around the world through live testimonies.

The most <u>unique aspect of the course</u> is the diversity and quality

of the instructors. Each session will be led by a different Biblical scholar, missionary, pastor, professor, or mobilizer who brings a wealth of experience and passion to each lesson. Students hear from 15 different instructors over the course of 15 weeks.

Here are some quick updates from our Valley Creek Campus:


- Installation of the new LED lights in the sanctuary is complete. They're brighter and more efficient!



Series Overview

The Apostle Paul declares, "For we are not fighting against flesh-and-blood enemies, but against evil rulers and authorities of the unseen world, against mighty powers in this dark world, and against evil spirits in the heavenly places." What does that even mean? Our battle is not against flesh and blood? What does it mean that our battle is against evil rulers of the unseen world and against evil spirits? (If you can reach out and pinch someone where there is conflict - that's NOT the battle.) Could it be that spiritual warfare is a thing, and if it is, how do we as disciples of Jesus prepare ourselves? Over the next four weeks come and discover how God has prepared you to live in victory without fear!

November 4, 2018

- Armor Up! The Belt and Body Armor
- Readings
 - Ephesians 6:10-18
 - Ephesians 6:14
 - Second Reading 1 Peter 4:12-19

FOCUS: The Apostle Paul makes one thing abundantly clear, as followers of Jesus we are engaged in a battle against Satan and his minions, but I wonder do we really believe this? Could it be that the everyday battles we experience in our relationships, communities and world are the result of a spiritual battle that is raging all around us? If this is true, how can we Armor Up! for the battles that lie ahead? It starts with a belt...

November 11, 2018

- Armor Up! The Shoes of Peace
- Readings
 - Ephesians 6:10-18
 - Ephesians 6:15
 - Second Reading Mark 14:32-38

Focus: Soldiers marching into battle needed shoes that brought protection and comfort. As disciples of Jesus, we must put on "gospel shoes" that will allow us to march wherever our Lord calls. The apostle John says, "He who says he abides in Him [Jesus] ought himself also to walk just as He [Jesus] walked" (1 John 2:6). Jesus said, "My sheep hear My voice,...and they follow Me" (John 10:27). Satan will try to place obstacles in our path, but in Jesus' strength we can walk forward, following our Lord, obeying Him, and advancing the gospel.

November 18, 2018

- Armor Up! The Shield of Faith
- Readings
 - Ephesians 6:10-18
 - Ephesians 6:16
 - Second Reading Daniel 3:19-30

Focus: In listing the different pieces of the armor of God, Paul says, "Above all,...[take] the shield of faith with which you will be able to quench all the fiery darts of the wicked one" When Satan attacks with doubts, the shield of faith turns aside the blow. When temptations come, faith keeps us steadfast in following Jesus. We are able to withstand all of the devil's fiery darts, because we know whom we have believed.

November 25, 2018

- Armor Up! The Helmet and Sword
- Readings
 - Ephesians 6:10-18
 - Ephesians 6:17
 - Second Reading Matthew 4:1-11

Focus: The helmet protects the head—perhaps the most vital part of the body since it is the seat of thought and the mind. When we have a sure knowledge of our salvation, we will not be moved by Satan's deceptions. When we are certain that we are in Christ with our sins forgiven, we will have a peace that nothing can disturb. The sword of the spirit is the only weapon of offense listed in the armor of God. God's Word—the Bible—is described as "living and powerful, and sharper than any two-edged sword" (Hebrews 4:12). Jesus used this weapon when Satan tempted Him in the wilderness. To each of Satan's efforts to lead Him into sin, Jesus replied, "it is written..."and proceeded to quote Scripture to destroy Satan's temptations. The sword of God's Word both protects us and destroys our enemy—the devil and his temptations.
